

Cut-in-PlaceAppliqué Instructions

- 1. Hoop your fabric and backing.
- 2. Sew the pattern/placement. **PHOTO 1**
- 3. Place a piece of appliqué fabric over the pattern/placement so that it is completely covered.
- 4. Sew the trim stitch/tackdown.
- 5. Carefully cut away the excess appliqué fabric.**PHOTO 2**
- 6. Sew the remainder of the design and repeat for any remaining pieces. **PHOTO 3**

Stitch 'n' Turn Instructions

- 1. Hoop a single layer of Mesh Cut-Away stabilizer.
- 2. Spray the stabilizer lightly with Temporary Adhesive Spray.
- 3. Stitch the first color, which is the "Placement Guide Stitch". Use a thread color that blends with your fabric choice.
- 4. Place a piece of fabric right side up onto the Mesh Stabilizer, being sure to cover the "Placement Guide Stitch". **See Photo 1**

Note: if using fabric with pile, lightly spray a piece of Wash-Away topping with Temporary Adhesive Spray. Place the topping sprayed side down onto the fabric.

- 5. Attach the hoop to the machine and embroider all but the last color of the design. **See Photo 2**.
- 6. Remove the hoop from the machine, but DO NOT remove the fabric from the hoop.
- 7. Clip all jump threads.
- 8. Gently tear away excess Wash-Away topping. (Do not wet to remove at this time).
- 9. Place another piece of fabric right side down directly over the first piece. If desired, pin or tape at corners to secure.
- 10. Reattach the hoop to the machine and stitch the final color change (through both layers of fabric). Use a thread color that blends with your fabric color. For photography purposes we've purposely used a contrasting thread.
- 11. Remove the hoop from the machine and the fabric from the hoop.
- 12. Using embroidery scissors, carefully cut out the stitch 'n' turn project close to the stitching line. Cut around the stitches at the opening to create a tab. **See Photo 3**.
- 13. Clip curves and corners as needed.
- 14. Turn the project right side out. Use a chopstick to turn out corners and curves.
- 15. Stuff with polyester stuffing. **Hint:** To speed up the stuffing process cut the bottom off of a cone shaped cup (such as the ones from a water cooler) and use it as a funnel to insert the stuffing. **See Photo 4**.
- 16. Fold tabs in and slip stitch the slit closed with hand needle or insert a piece of fusible webbing and fuse closed.

For Extra Fun:

- Add definition stitching with a sewing machine or by hand.
- Stitch ribbon bows or embellishments on your projects to dress them up. Please keep in mind the age of the person to be using them then plan (or omit) add-ons accordingly.

NOTE: Some designs may contain a Ribbon Placement Guide. This is an optional feature that allows you to turn your designs into ornaments if you


so wish. To create a hanging loop, after stitching the Ribbon Placement Guide, create a loop out of 1/4" ribbon and place it within the guide with loop facing into the center of the project and tails of the ribbon facing out. Lightly spray ribbon with Temporary Adhesive Spray to hold in place.






Supplies:

- 2 pieces of fabric one inch larger (in all dimensions) than chosen design
- Mesh Cut-Away Stabilizer
- Wash-Away topping (if using fabric with pile such as Minkee® or terrycloth)
- Temporary Adhesive Spray
- Embroidery Thread
- · Polyester bobbin thread
- Embroidery machine
- · Polyester stuffing
- · Hand needle or fusible webbing









Seed Packet Instructions


- 1. Hoop 2 layers of Cut Away stabilizer. See **Photo 1**.
- 2. Lightly spray the cut away stabilizer with temporary adhesive spray. Place a piece of felt (preferably a high-quality wool felt, but most types of felt can be used) onto the stabilizer. See **Photo 2**.
- 3. Stitch your design, following the instructions for pre-cut appliqués as needed. DO NOT stitch the last color change. See **Photo 3**.
- 4. Remove the hoop from the machine and flip over the hoop so you are looking at the back of the embroidery. See **Photo 4**.
- 5. Lightly spray the back of the hoop with temporary adhesive spray. Place another piece of felt onto the back of the stabilizer. Your felt should be at least ½" larger than your embroidery in all directions. See **Photo 5**.
- 6. Stitch the "Seam" by returning the hoop to the machine and stitching the last color change. See **Photo 6**.
- 7. Remove the embroidery from the hoop. Using a rotary cutter and ruler, trim both layers of felt ½" from the seam and ¼" from the top edge.
- 8. Cut felt "seeds" to place in your seed packets so your little gardener can plant away!



Pocket Quilt Project

SUPPLIES:

- 1 yard brown cotton quilting fabric (or assorted brown scraps 16 pieces 10" by 6")
- ²/₃ yard green cotton quilting fabric (or assorted green scraps 16 6" squares)
- 1 yard ochre cotton quilting fabric
- Finished Stitch and Turn Veggies from Veggie Garden Play set (see instructions for creating a stitch and turn design on Page 5).
- Finished Seed Packets from Veggie Garden Play set (see instructions for creating seed packets on Page 6)
- Cutting Instructions: (See Image 1)

Note: WOF stands for width of fabric. When you see this, fold the fabric selvedge to selvedge and cut through both layers to form one long strip to get a piece the full width of the fabric.

Instructions are given for both strip piecing and for a scrappy version of the quilt. When using the strip piecing method, all the blocks will be the same. When using the scrappy instructions, you will have four different green fabrics and four different brown fabrics. When cutting the scrappy version, be sure to plan before you cut to make sure you are cutting your pieces in the most efficient way.

Brown Fabric:

Cut (16) 10" by 6" rectangles. See **Image 1**.

Strip Piecing: Cut 4 WOF strips 6" wide, then cut 4 10" rectangles from each strip.


Scrappy: Cut 4 10" by 6" rectangles from each of four different brown fabrics

• Green Fabric:

Cut (16) 6" squares

Strip Piecing: Cut 3 WOF strips 6" wide, then
cut 6 6" squares from each strip (You will
have 2 extra squares)

Scrappy: Cut 4 6" squares from each of four
different green fabrics



• Ochre Fabric:

Cut (32) 2" by 6" rectangles Cut (32) 2" by 9" rectangles Strip piecing: Cut 14 WOF strips 2" wide.

- From 8 of these strips, cut 4 9" rectangles from each strip for a total of 32 9" by 2" rectangles.
- From the remaining 6 strips, cut 6 6" rectangles from each strip for a total of 36 6" by 2" rectangles (this is actually four more than you need)



Pocket Quilt Project

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Fold and press the brown fabric to form the "pockets".

• Fold each 10" by 6" rectangle in half to form a 5" by 6" rectangle. Press to form a permanent crease. See **Image 2**.

2. Arrange the "pockets" onto the green squares.

- Align each brown rectangle onto a green square. If creating a scrappy version, mix and match the brown fabrics with the green fabrics to get a variety of combinations.
- The unfolded 6" edge should align with one edge of the square. See **Image 3**. If desired, baste the folded rectangle onto the green square. See **Image 4**. The folded edge of the pocket will be 1" from the top edge of the green rectangle.

3. Sew the side rectangles to each block.

- Place a 2" by 6" strip right sides together with a brown/green square set. The 2" strip should be along the side of the pocket as shown. Stitch along this edge with a quarter inch seam. Repeat for all 16 blocks. Press so the seam is under the ochre strip. See **Image 5**.
- Repeat the process on the other side of the square, stitching the other 2" by 6" strips to the other side of the pockets. Press. You will now have a rectangle measuring 9" by 6".


4. Stitch the top and bottom rectangles to each block.


Place a 2" by 9" strip across the top of each block, right sides together. Stitch with a ¹/₄" seam. Repeat with the remaining 2" strips, sewing them with a ¹/₄" seam to the bottom of each block. Press so the seams are under the ochre fabric. You will now have 16 blocks. See Image 6.

5. Stitch the blocks together.


 Important: if you are creating a scrappy version of this quilt, arrange your blocks out on a design wall, table or the floor to make sure you like the arrangement of your blocks before stitching them

together. You will then need to stitch the blocks together using the diagram below to make sure your blocks end up in the chosen arrangement. If all your blocks are the same, you will stitch together the same sets, but don't need to worry about arrangement. See Image 7.















Pocket Quilt Project







- Stitch 2 blocks together along one side edge. Align the seams as you stitch. Repeat to make 8 sets of 2 blocks. See **Image 8.**
- Stitch 2 of these sets together along one side edge. Align the seams as you stitch. Repeat to make 4 rows of 4 blocks. See **Image 9**.
- Stitch 2 rows together to make a set of two rows. Align the seams as you stitch. Repeat so you have 2 sets of 2 rows. See **Image 10**.
- Finally, stitch the 2 sets of 2 rows together, aligning the seams as you stitch.
- Your top is done! Press it well before starting the next step.



6. Cut the backing fabric and batting to size.

- The finished quilt top measures 35 ½", so your backing and batting should be slightly larger than this to make quilting the project easy.
- Cut your backing fabric to a 38" square.
- Cut a piece of batting 36 ½" square.
- Press both pieces flat.

7. Create the quilt "sandwich"

- We will now layer the fabrics. A quilt of this size can be easily basted with temporary adhesive spray. If you prefer, skip the adhesive spray directions below and pin-baste the quilt together.
- Lay the quilt backing onto a flat surface, wrong side up.
- Lightly spray the entire wrong side of the fabric with temporary adhesive spray.

- Now spread the batting over the backing square, smoothing it into place to make sure there are no wrinkles.
- Lightly spray the exposed side of the batting with temporary adhesive spray.
- Spread the quilt top onto the batting, smoothing it in place, but taking care not to stretch your blocks out of alignment. Smooth from the center of the top out.

8. Quilt the layers together.

- Now that your layers are together, you can quilt the layers together as desired. Quilting should only be done in the ochre fabric areas. DO NOT QUILT the brown/green squares, your pockets will be sewn shut!
- To quilt your pocket quilt like the example, stitch a wide zig-zag (about 5mm wide and stitch length of about 5mm) across each of the seams joining the blocks. Use a center-guide sewing foot to keep the zig-zag centered over the seam. Then, stitch a zig-zag over the seams adjoining the top and bottom rectangles to each block. See Images 11 and 12.

9. Square up the finished quilt.

• Once the quilt is quilted, you will remove the extra batting and backing fabric from the outside of the quilt. Using a quilting ruler to ensure that your cuts are parallel to the block seams, cut the finished quilt so that all three layers are the size of the quilt top (35 ½"). See **Image 13.**

10. Attach the binding.

Attach the binding to the outside of your quilt as desired.
In the example, double fold bias with a finished size of
 ¹/₂" was used. It was attached using a zig-zag stitch to
 match the quilting.

11. Put your finished veggie garden playset toys into the finished pocket quilts!
