

Step 1

- Fabric Requirement:
 (2) 8" x 6.5" pieces of Minkee fabric in desired color.
- Hoop one layer of OESD PolyMesh CutAway stabilizer.
- Stitch the first color called Placement Stitch. Use a thread color that blends with your fabric choice.



Step 2

• Place the fabric (8" x 6.5") right side up onto the stabilizer, completely covering the Placement Stitch.



- Lay the StitcH2O topper over the fabric and tape in place with Expert Embroidery Tape TearAway.
- Raise the presser foot if possible to accommodate the added loft of the fabric. If not, slow the machine speed.
- · Stitch the second color, the Tackdown Stitch.

Step 4

Stitch the next few colors until you get to the seam stitch.



Step 5

• Place the second piece of fabric right side down directly over the first piece.



Step 6

• Stitch the final color, again using the first thread color, called Seam - Match Top Fabric (For visual purposes we used a bright color so you could see the seam).

Step 7

- Remove the hoop from the machine and the fabric from the hoop.
- Using scissors, carefully cut out the stitch 'n' turn project close to the stitching line. Cut around the stitches at the opening to create a tab.



Step 8

- · Clip to seam line at corners and on curves.
- Turn the project right side out. Use Expert Point and Press Tool to turn out corners and curves.



- Trim any jump stitches and then peel off the StitcH2O topping.
- · Stuff with polyester fiberfill.
- Note: For a smooth project, add small pieces of fiberfill until desired fullness is reached. Use Expert Point and Press tool to move fiberfill into corners.
- Fold tabs in and slip stitch the slit closed with a hand needle, or use a narrow machine zigzag stitch.




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
Step 1

- Fabric Requirement:
 - Assorted 6" x 4" Minkee fabric in desired color. (Candy Corn takes 3 colors, Owl uses 2).
 - (1) 8" x6.5" piece of Minkee in desired color for back.
- Hoop one layer of OESD PolyMesh CutAway stabilizer.
- Stitch the first color called Placement Stitch. Use a thread color that blends with your fabric choice.




Step 2

 Cut at least a 6"x 4" piece of Minkee for the first placement stitch being sure that the Placement Stitch is covered by the fabric.



- Lay the StitcH2O topper over the fabric and tape in place with Expert Embroidery Tape TearAway.
- Raise the presser foot if possible to accommodate the added loft of the fabric. If not, slow the machine speed.
- Stitch the second color, the Tackdown Stitch.




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
Step 4

 Only trim the center fabric next to the cut line and tackdown stitch. DO NOT TRIM OUTSIDE OF THE DESIGN UNTIL ALL IS FINISHED.



Step 5

- Continue the same process for the next two steps.
- Sew Placement Stitch, cover with fabric, place (OESD StitcH2O) topping over and sew tackdown and cutline stitch and only trim the the center. DO NOT TRIM OUTSIDE OF DESIGN UNTIL ALL IS FINISHED.

Step 7

 Make sure the middle color is trimmed close to the cut line and tackdown stitch then sew the cover stitch. Then stitch the rest of the colors on the front of the design until you get to the seam.



Step 8

 Place the second piece of fabric right side down directly over the first piece.



Step 9

 Stitch the final color, again using the first thread color, called Seam - Match Top Fabric. (For visual purposes we used a bright color so you could see the seam)

Step 10

- Remove the hoop from the machine and the fabric from the hoop.
- Using scissors, carefully cut out the stitch 'n' turn project close to the stitching line. Cut around the stitches at the opening to create a tab.



Step 11

- Clip corners as needed.
- Turn the project right side out. Use Expert Point and Press Tool to turn out corners and curves.






Step 1

- Fabric Requirements:
 - (2) Pieces 7.5" x 6" of Minkee fabric in desired color. (8 pieces of rick rack cut to 5" each for legs).
- Hoop one layer of OESD PolyMesh CutAway stabilizer.
- Stitch the first color called Placement Stitch. Use a thread color that blends with your fabric choice.



Step 2

• Cut a 7.5"x 6" piece of Minkee for the first placement stitch being sure that the Placement Stitch is covered by the fabric.



- Lay the StitcH2O topper over the fabric and tape in place with Expert Embroidery Tape TearAway.
- Raise the presser foot if possible to accommodate the added loft of the fabric. If not, slow the machine speed.
- · Stitch the second color, the Tackdown Stitch.






Step 4

• Sew the rest of the colors on the design and stop after you sew Rick Rack tackdown stitch.



Step 5

- Cut 8 pieces of Rick Rack 5" and Place direction of the placement stitches with the largest part of the Rick Rack on the inside and the smallest section on the outside. Using OESD Expert Embroidery TearAway Tape. Tape the small part of the Rick Rack on the outside of the design making sure the longer piece doesn't go outside the Tackdown Stitch.
- Do the same process for that side and the other side.



Step 6


 Sew the next color Rick Rack Tackdown sew this slowly and make sure the Rick Rack don't get hung up on your sewing foot. It should sew over the tape you put on the Rick Rack.






Step 7

 Place the second piece of fabric right side down directly over the first piece.



Step 8

 Stitch the final color, again using the first thread color, called Seam - Match Top Fabric. (For visual purposes we used a bright color so you could see the seam)




- Remove the hoop from the machine and the fabric from the hoop.
- Using scissors, carefully cut out the stitch 'n' turn project close to the stitching line and over the small pieces of Rick Rack. Cut around the stitches at the opening to create a tab.





Step 10

- · Clip corners as needed.
- Turn the project right side out. Use a point turner or chopstick to turn out corners and curves.



- Trim any jump stitches and then peel off the StitcH2O topping.
- Stuff with polyester fiberfill.
- **Note**: For a smooth project, add small pieces of fiberfill until desired fullness is reached. Use Expert Point and Press tool to move fiberfill into corners.
- Fold tabs in and slip stitch the slit closed with a hand needle, or use a narrow machine zigzag stitch.
